I. Statutes

I.1 Federal Statutes

Key Federal statutes relating to housing include the *Fair Housing Act* and *Department of Housing and Urban Development Act*. Both are codified in the *United States Code* in Title 42. The *Fair Housing Act* is codified at 42 U.S.C. § 3601 *et seq.* and the *Department of Housing and Urban Development Act* is codified at 42 U.S.C. § 3531 *et seq.*

I.2 NY Consolidated and Unconsolidated Laws

Several titles of NY's consolidated laws include provisions relating to housing. Those titles include *General Obligations Law*, *Real Property Law*, *Real Property Actions Proceedings Law*, *Multiple Dwelling Law* and *Multiple Residence Law*. Moreover, several of NY's unconsolidated laws also include provisions relating to rent control and/or rent stabilization. Those include *Local Emergency Housing Rent Control*, *New York City Rent Control Law*, *Emergency Tenant Protection Act*, *Emergency Housing Rent Control Law*, and *New York City Rent Stabilization*.

II. Agencies

II.1 Department of Housing and Urban Development

The mission of the Department of Housing and Urban Development, a Federal Agency, “is to increase homeownership, support community development and increase access to affordable housing free from discrimination.”³ Among other things, HUD administers a number of affordable housing programs and enforces Federal fair housing laws.

II.2 Division of Housing and Community Renewal

The Division of Housing and Community Renewal (DHCR), a NY State Agency, is “responsible for the supervision, maintenance and development of affordable low- and moderate-income housing in New York State.”⁴ Among other things, DHCR holds hearings on rent-related issues in its jurisdiction.

IV.1 NY Courts and NY Judicial Decisions

NY Courts range from trial courts to various types of appeal courts. The Court of Appeals is New York's highest court. Additional appellate courts include Appellate Divisions of the Supreme Court and Appellate Terms of the Supreme Court. Statewide trial courts include the Supreme Court, County Courts, Family Courts, Surrogate's Courts and the Court of Claims. Trial courts for New York City include the Civil Court of the City of New York and the Criminal Court of the City of New York. Among other topics, housing issues are covered in some NY court judicial opinions.
