

2013 Summer Living in New York Program Statement of Housing Policy Regarding Families

Goals and Principles

It is the policy of the Law School and the Summer Living in New York program to allocate housing in its dormitories under policies that do not discriminate on the basis of the race, religious creed, color, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, age, handicap, or marital or parental status of any housing applicant.

Obligation to Pay Rent

The obligation to pay rent from families residing in Law School dormitory units will be the sole responsibility of the student member of the family, and the Law School will look solely to the student member of the family to fulfill that obligation. No relief from the obligation will be available for the licensee if his or her status in the family changes during the license period.

Eligibility

To be eligible for family housing at the Law School, the applicant for such status must demonstrate that the individual(s) with whom the applicant/licensee is applying share a qualifying family relationship. Qualifying family relationships under this policy are those relationships that evidence a significant emotional commitment on the part of the members of the relationship. Qualifying relationships do not include, however, a relationship with a lineal ancestor or sibling, other than a minor sibling for whom an adult member of the family is the legal guardian.

Evidence of Family Status

In determining whether the applicants constitute a qualifying family relationship, the following shall be acceptable evidence of such a relationship: (a) in the case of any family, an affidavit from both adult members of the family, declaring that the applicants share a qualifying family relationship, evidenced by significant emotional commitment on the part of the adult members of the family; and (b) In the case of a minor child, a birth certificate, adoption papers, or evidence that an adult member of the family is the minor child's legal guardian.

Review of Eligibility

All applications for family housing will be reviewed by the Director of Residence Services before being approved for room allocation.

Responsibility

The licensee of the family is solely responsible for the behavior of the family members, and the family members' guests, while residing in Law School Housing. All family housing residents (those who are not the licensee) must obtain an NYU ID card and are not provided with ResNet or Coles/Palladium access.

Mail and Packages

Assigned parties to family housing will have the automatic privileges of picking up mail and packages for all habitants of the apartment.

Affidavit for Family Housing for the 2013 Summer Living in New York Program

We, the undersigned, declare that we share a qualifying family relationship under the family housing policy of New York University School of Law, as evidenced by our significant emotional commitment to each other, thereby qualifying us for eligibility for family housing for the 2011 Summer Living in New York program. We understand that the available family housing at NYU Law will be allocated under the rules established by the Law School that do not discriminate on the basis of the race, religious creed, color, national origin, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity/expression, age, handicap, or marital or parental status of any housing applicant. If there are more eligible applications for family housing than available spaces, we understand that the available spaces will be allocated among eligible applications under the rules established by the Director of Residence Services.

We understand that this affidavit applies only to the 2013 summer housing allocation, and that eligibility for family housing in subsequent summers must be reestablished under the policies then in effect.
