All matriculated students may use the Student Health Center (SHC) whether enrolled in an NYUsponsored student health insurance plan or maintaining alternate health insurance coverage. No student will be denied services. The multidisciplinary staff of board certified physicians and highly trained clinicians provide confidential comprehensive health and wellness services for routine and acute medical care, counseling and behavioral health, and health education.

SHC offers routine and walk-in primary care and women's health services at no cost or reduced cost. In addition, short-term counseling (talk therapy) and crisis services are free of charge. There are fees for some procedures performed at the SHC. These fees will be billed to the student or his/her insurance company. Students may be billed for deductibles, co-insurance or fees not covered by insurance. Complete optometry services including eyewear and contact lenses, and pharmacy services are also available.

CBH offers confidential psychological assessments, short-term individual counseling, psychiatric medication management services, group counseling and self-improvement classes. Students can contact CBH for help dealing with a variety of personal problems such as: depression, anxiety, stress, loneliness, family or other relationships, alcohol and other drugs, eating disorders, sexual issues and self-esteem issues.

Students who need longer-term therapy can receive referrals to private therapists or low-fee community clinics. Students are strongly encouraged to have any specialized support service needs in place prior to coming to NYU.

New York University requires students to have health insurance that meets specific standards. Therefore, **most students are enrolled automatically** in one of several NYU-sponsored Student Health Insurance Plans as part of the course registration process. Students who maintain alternate health insurance coverage that meets the University's criteria can waive the NYU plan.

The NYU-sponsored Student Health Insurance Basic and Comprehensive Plans are designed to provide reasonably priced worldwide healthcare coverage for medically-necessary treatment. Students seeking services in Manhattan must first seek treatment at SHC.

Students at the School of Law are enrolled in the Student Health Insurance Plans as follows:

<u>International Students with F-1 or J-1 Status</u> (any number of credits, degree and non-degree) are enrolled automatically in the **Comprehensive Plan**, but may select the Basic Plan or Waiver Option.

Students registered in a degree-granting program of 6 or more credits are enrolled automatically in the **Basic Plan**, but may select the Comprehensive Plan or Waiver Option.

Students registered in a degree-granting program of less than 6 credits are not enrolled automatically, but may select the Basic Plan or Comprehensive Plan.

Whether or not you waive the NYU Student Health Insurance Plans, all matriculated students have access to the many no cost or reduced cost services at the Student Health Center.

Health Requirements

NYU students are required to submit the following information to the Student Health Center. Timely completion allows the SHC to serve students in the best possible manner.

- 1. New York State Public Health Laws 2165 and 2167 require that all students taking six credits or more:
 - a) Provide proof of immunity to measles, mumps and rubella.
 - b) Submit a Meningitis Response Form
- 2. Health History Questionnaire

The health history information is required to assist SHC staff in understanding your health care needs so that the best treatment can be provided when, and if, you need it.
