

## Academic Year 2026-27 BWLC Visiting Fellows-in-Residence

The Birnbaum Women's Leadership Center (BWLC) at NYU School of Law invites applications for Visiting Fellows-in-Residence for the 2026-27 academic year. Ideal candidates are legal scholars with sabbatical funding who seek to undertake research and writing, organize events, and otherwise collaborate on projects focused on women's rights and gender justice.

Visiting Fellows-in-Residence work directly with BWLC's faculty director, executive director, staff, and students for the duration of a semester or full academic year. During that time, Visiting Fellows-in-Residence are provided with a shared on-campus office equipped with tech/support, as well as access to Law School events, communication networks/listservs, libraries, etc.

Applicants should submit the following materials by **March 31, 2026**, via electronic mail to womensleadership@nyu.edu:

- current curriculum vitae
- writing sample
- brief description of work proposed to be undertaken while at the BWLC
- proposed time period of residency (i.e., one or two semesters)
