FALL 2025 HOLIDAY MAKE-UP SCHEDULE

According to the academic calendar, approved by the faculty, classes are not suspended on all holidays. Nonetheless, we know that many people (students and faculty) may be observing certain holidays.

In keeping with past practice, we have prepared a make-up schedule for only the <u>EVE</u> and <u>FIRST</u> <u>day</u> of various holidays. This schedule was created based on the fall holidays observed by the New York City Department of Education. Of particular interest to some may be the following holidays during fall 2025:

- Rosh Hashanah
 - Monday, September 22 (sundown) see the make-up schedule below
 - Tuesday, September 23 see the make-up schedule below
- Yom Kippur
 - Wednesday, October 1 (sundown) see the make-up schedule below
 - Thursday, October 2 see the make-up schedule below
- Diwali
 - Monday, October 20 see the make-up schedule below

Note: No make-up schedule has been created for the holidays that have no direct impact on classes.

If you intend to cancel one or more classes in observance of the fall holidays for which there is a makeup schedule, please adhere to the following assigned days and times in which to make up your class.

By strictly adhering to this fixed make-up calendar, it is possible to avoid make-up class conflicts for students that would otherwise occur.

For those who do not cancel class, consistent with the Law School's general policy, please record your fall 2025 class. Observing students will follow the normal practice of accessing the recording and watching the missed class at a later time.

If you plan to schedule a make-up class, please have your assistant reserve your currently scheduled room as soon as possible. Please keep in mind that the make-up class you schedule may meet for a shorter or longer time than the make-up block. <u>Please schedule your make-up class for the same number of minutes as the canceled class.</u>
