motion filed by petitioners Environmental Defense Fund, *et al.* on November 13, 2020 for a partial stay of the final agency action taken by Respondents United States Environmental Protection Agency and Administrator Andrew R. Wheeler, in his official capacity, titled “Oil and Natural Gas Sector: Emission Standards for New, Reconstructed, and Modified Sources Reconsideration,” 85 Fed. Reg. 57,398 (Sept. 15, 2020) (hereinafter, “Rollback Rule”). For the reasons set forth in that motion, State Petitioners concur that the provisions of the Rollback Rule weakening leak mitigation requirements for compressor stations (40 C.F.R. § 60.5397a(g)(2)) and eliminating such requirements for low production wells (40 C.F.R. § 60.5397a(a)) should be stayed pending merits review.
