Exclude classroom courses that were converted to distance education learning courses in 2020, 2021 and 2022 due to the pandemic. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. If yes, how many credits were awarded for Distance Education courses (this includes live audiovisual or online web-conferencing, correspondence or pre-recorded lectures)? (See Rule 520.3[c]) Exclude classroom courses that were converted to distance education learning courses in 2020, 2021 and 2022 due to the pandemic.</li> <li>b. 7	<b>Number of Calendar Months for Completion of Juris Doctor degree.</b> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. Enter the month and year the applicant first commenced the study of law whether at your current law school or at another law school from which you received transfer credits.</li> <li>b. Enter the month and year the applicant completed all coursework for the Juris Doctor degree. Note that this is NOT necessarily the same as the month of graduation.</li> </ul>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>a. List the month and year when you began your 1L year – even if NOT at NYU Law</li> <li>b. Month/Year</li> </ul>

After your application is processed, the Board will use your answers to the above questions to generate a Certificate of Attendance (COA) form, which the Board will electronically submit directly to your law school. Your law school will be required to electronically certify the COA form to the Board by January 15th for a February exam and June 15th for a July exam.

**\*Dual degree students, please enter 83 credits or however many total LAW-LW credits you have completed, including the 12 credits that will be transferred from the other school. Example: If you took 71 Law credits and 12 credits will be transferred from the other degree program, then enter 83 credits.**
