In FY 2017, there were 11 defendants categorized as Other, 51 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and 7 defendants admitted guilt. There were 69 defendants in FY 2017. In FY 2018, there were 6 defendants categorized as Other, 72 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and 2 defendants admitted guilt. There were 80 defendants in FY 2018. In FY 2019, there were 6 defendants categorized as Other, 97 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and 5 defendants admitted guilt. There were 108 defendants in FY 2019. In FY 2020, there were 5 defendants categorized as Other, 59 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and 2 defendants admitted guilt. There were 66 defendants in FY 2020. A new SEC Chair was sworn in in FY 2021. In FY 2021, there were 3 defendants categorized as Other, 50 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and no defendants admitted guilt. There were 53 defendants in FY 2021. In FY 2022, there were 3 defendants categorized as Other, 56 defendants neither admitted nor denied the allegations, and 16 defendants admitted guilt. There were 75 defendants in FY 2022.
