Student Fellowships

Each year, the Program on Corporate Compliance and Enforcement accepts a group of outstanding law students as Fellows. PCCE Student Fellows gain unparalleled expertise in the areas of corporate compliance and enforcement through exposure to our invitation-only conferences, panels, and policy speeches, access to our distinguished Senior Fellows and members of our Board of Advisors, including at PCCE events and Fellows receptions, and opportunities (although not requirements) to perform research and other PCCE work as a research assistant, contribute to white papers, serve as an editor of our blog, [Compliance & Enforcement](#), and publish scholarship relating to corporate compliance and enforcement (including on our blog).

Student fellows are required to volunteer at at least one PCCE conference or event each semester. Volunteering entails either assistance with registration or other logistics over the course of the event, or note-taking during keynote addresses or panels.

Eligibility Requirements

PCCE Student Fellowship positions are open to rising 2L, 3L, and LLM students at NYU Law with experience in corporate compliance or enforcement. Applications for an academic year generally are accepted on a rolling basis until a few months before the start of the fall semester. Applications should be sent to PCCE's Executive Director, alicyn.cooley@nyu.edu, and PCCE's Assistant Director, clarissa.santiago@nyu.edu, and should include a cover email, unofficial transcript, and curriculum vitae. Applicants must either have already taken, or register to take in the upcoming academic year, one or more of the following PCCE-taught or -affiliated courses: Business Crime; Corporate Crime and Financial Misdealing; Compliance and Risk Management for Attorneys; Regulation of Foreign Corrupt Practices; White Collar Crime and the Capital Markets. In the event an applicant is interested in taking a different course that relates to corporate compliance or enforcement, the applicant should indicate that in his/her/their application.
